# DOS AND DON'TS OF WORKING WITH INDEPENDENT MUSEUM PROFESSIONALS (IMPs)

#### Do

- 1. Do know why you need an IMP and consider if an IMP individual, team, or firm is best suited to your project.
- 2. Do use your network's network to find your IMP.
- 3. Do specify a budget amount/range in RFPs and RFQs.
- 4. Do know what you need and set realistic expectations (scope of work, schedule).
- 5. Do choose an IMP you like (you'll be working closely together!)
- 6. Do collaborate on the contract or letter of engagement so it's equitable for all.
- 7. Do plan ahead and include options in the contract for if something goes wrong.
- 8. Do identify a single point of contact to direct the IMP and for the IMP to ask questions
- 9. Do develop a relationship grounded in dignity, mutual respect, and trust.
- 10. Do recommend or hire your IMP again.

## Don't

- 1. Don't limit your IMP options.
- 2. Don't ask IMPs to apply for work if you have already identified someone you wish to work with and do not intend to consider them seriously for the role.
- 3. Don't request or require an IMP to complete work for free.
- 4. Don't compare an IMP's rate to that of a salaried employee.
- 5. Don't treat an IMP like a full-time employee expecting them to be available any time you are.
- 6. Don't forget to set aside time to review work products and manage the contract.
- 7. Don't slow down or stall the process by failing to make timely decisions, submissions, and approvals.
- 8. Don't let the scope creep (set realistic schedules, plan ahead).

- 9. Don't keep it inside or hold back concerns. Establish frequent, open, and respectful communication.
- 10. Don't hesitate to provide a testimonial–IMPs really appreciate that.
